



1. Rise in Love / By Siddharth Roy





B. Yerram Raju



3. Internationalization of Higher Education in India / by Yeravdekar



4. <u>Consciousness: Integrating Eastern and Western Perspectives / By Prem</u> <u>Sarang Satsangi</u>



5. Spatial Information Technology for Sustainable Development Goals / By Dilip Kumar






