Institutional Structure for implementation and monitoring of SDGs

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- Planning Department is the 'Nodal Department' for SDG implementation
- Centre for SDG Implementation established in Directorate of Economics & Statistics
- State level Implementation and Monitoring committee for SDGs
- 7 Sectoral Working Groups
- District level Implementation and Monitoring committee for SDGs
- Nodal Officers and Data Focal points nominated in each department
- UNICEF is providing technical & financial support for capacity building

Indicators and data on progress

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- Mapped 17 SDGs with CSS, State Schemes and Interventions. Mapping of schemes with SDG targets have also been initiated
- Identified department-wise related goals, targets and indicators along with mapping of centre and state schemes
- Carried out exercise to find out availability of data on draft National Indicator Framework and NITI Aayog Priority Indicators
 - Out of 306 draft national indicators, data for 205 indicators collected
 - Out of 63 priority indicators, data for 59 indicators collected

Capacity Building

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- Organized State level orientation workshop of concern departments
- Two State level review meetings and workshop were organized
- In partnership with UNICEF, a capacity building workshop for key departments was organized
- One to one meetings with nodal officers/data focal point were organized at the level of Planning Department/DES

Capacity Building Conti.

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- For District and PRI level, Indira Gandhi Panchayati Raj and Gramin Vikas Sansthan (SIRD & PR) has organized trainings/workshops for sensitization and awareness development on SDGs and their integrations with Gram Panchayat development plans and District Plan.
- Directions have been issued for including at least one session on SDGs in each training programme being organized by various departments/training institutes
- 7 divisional level workshops have been planned and will be organized in the month of January-February, 2019.

New initiatives

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- All Central and State schemes have been assigned unique scheme code and all budget heads have been mapped with these scheme codes in IFMS
- Schematic Budget allocations for each SDGs is being mapped by Planning Department
- Online interface/module for mapping of state scheme budget allocations with SDGs on IFMS is to be developed. An annexure for allocation of budget for each SDGs will be incorporated in budget volume
- A chapter on SDGs implementation will be included in Economic Review from next year onwards
- Dashboard for monitoring SDGs is being prepared

Issues and Challenges

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- Lack of expertise in line departments regarding projections for the milestones to be achieved by 2022-23 and by 2030.
- Validity of administrative data coming from regular monitoring system/MIS
- Unavailability of Metadata for National Indicators
- Collection of periodic and disaggregated data for district and block level
- Capacity Building of State level Master Trainers
